



WHAT LUGGAGE TO USE ON A SAFARI

If you are travelling to your safari destination on a small plane, please check the baggage weight allowance before you arrive to check-in.

For most small planes, the limit is between 15kg / 33lbs (almost always in East Africa & Namibia) and 20kg / 44lbs (mostly in South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe & Botswana). Most airlines require your luggage to be in soft bags, to enable the pilot to easily stow the luggage in a small luggage compartment.

There are some airlines that accept soft luggage with wheels, but we highly recommend taking luggage without wheels and sticking to the weight limitation to ensure ease of travel.

For multiple destination journeys where you will need more luggage, there are luggage storage options.

Please contact your travel manager prior to travel to discuss a bespoke luggage plan for your travels.

The weight limit almost always includes hand luggage, cameras, laptops etc.



As a rule, the maximum dimensions for any type of bag should not exceed the following measurements: 65cm (24 inches) long X 40cm (16 inches) wide X 30cm (12 inches) high.

Please discuss exact requirement with your travel manager prior to travel.
